<p>Sign of <u>spring</u></p> <p>Spring flower, green grass, leaves on a branch, birds chirping</p>	<p>Animal <u>home</u></p> <p>Cocoons, galls, chrysalises, nests, pile of leaves, decaying branch, web, ant hill</p>
<p>Something that nature <u>does not need</u></p> <p>Litter, car, table</p> <p>Note - Natural items have a function.</p>	<p><u>Insect</u></p> <p>Something with 3 body parts.</p> <p>(Antennae, 6 legs, usually wings)</p>
<p>Something important in <u>nature</u> that is <u>living</u></p> <p>Tree, flowers for nectar that is made into honey, herbs, plants</p>	<p>Something important in <u>nature</u> that is <u>not living</u></p> <p>Rocks, leaves on the ground</p>
<p><u>Animal</u> that <u>eats dead</u> plants and dead animals</p> <p>Earthworm, pill bug, sow bug, millipede, slug, snail</p>	<p>Source of <u>energy</u></p> <p>Sun, leaves, an animal eaten as food, nectar, dead plants and dead animals</p>
<p>Air <u>temperature</u></p>	<p>Soil <u>temperature</u></p>
